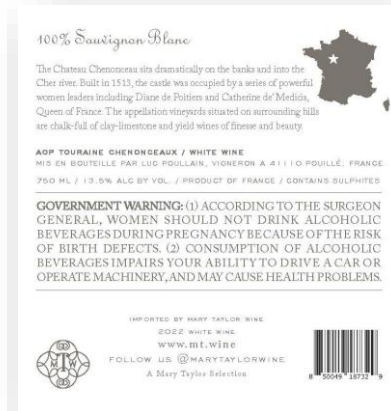

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Chenonceaux



Another wonderful wine from Luc Poullain in the Touraine. The AOC Touraine Chenonceaux is a recent appellation directly related to the prestigious Château de Chenonceaux which was built in 1513 and was once occupied by a series of powerful women such as Diane de Poitiers and Catherine de Médicis. The soil is notable for being pure chalk.

Officially recognized in 2011, the AOC Touraine Chenonceaux appellation stretches along both sides of the Cher river in the Loire Valley, and is composed of only 110ha located on limestone and flint-clay hillsides. As part of his passion and commitment to this unique vineyard, Luc Poullain has also been the president of the AOC Touraine Chenonceaux appellation for a dozen years, making sure to perpetuate Château de Chenonceaux's history and legacy.

This Touraine Chenonceaux white wine, made exclusively of Sauvignon Blanc grapes, is intensively aromatic, revealing aromas of white flowers, ripe fruits, citrus and exotic fruits. It's a full-bodied wine, round and powerful, with a long and delicious finish. Luc Poullain's expertise, combined with an exceptional terroir full of history, gives the wine a unique character and invites us to travel back in time through the prestigious and fascinating story of the Château de Chenonceaux.
