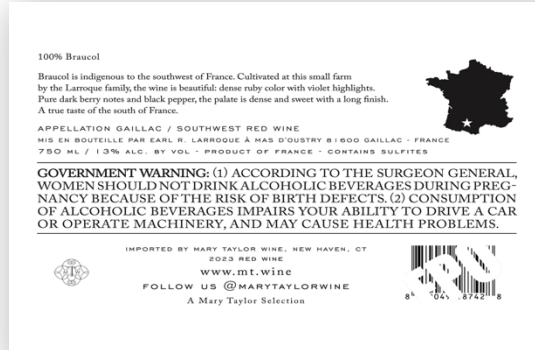
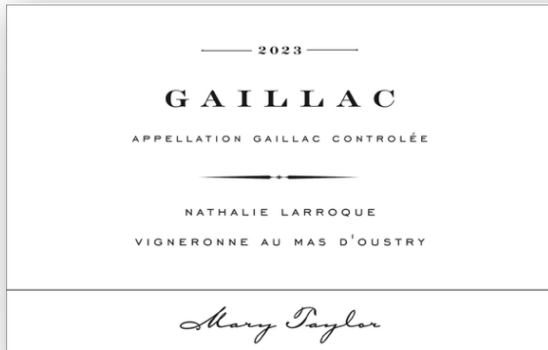

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Nathalie Larroque - Gaillac Braucol



Braucol is an ancient, local grape variety typical of the Southwest France, also known as Fer Servadou. Braucol is known for its rustic charm, firm tannins, and aromatic profile marked by black fruits, sweet spices, and subtle vegetal notes such as a grilled pepper. It thrives in the Gaillac terroir and is rarely found outside this region.

The Gaillac appellation is the second oldest wine regions in France (after Narbonne), with viticultural roots going back more than two thousand years. Vines were first planted here during the Roman era, and wine from Gaillac was exported along the Tarn River as early as the 1st century AD. Located between Toulouse and Albi, the region benefits from both oceanic and Mediterranean influences, ideal for full grape ripening. The varied soils, especially the historic hillsides, produce expressive and age-worthy red wines.

The Larroque family is cultivating vines since the 16th century and practices sustainable agriculture, respecting the balance of the local ecosystem and focusing on authentic expression of its historic terroir. As part of its commitment for this historic terroir, the Larroque family offers us this unique Gaillac Braucol which reflects all the work, dedication and passion it has been perpetuating over centuries.
