


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Pascale Rion Vosne-Romanée 1er Cru « Les Beaux Monts »





The vineyards of Burgundy, and especially those of Côte de Nuits, are deeply rooted in centuries of viticultural tradition. As early as the Middle Ages, Cistercian monks developed a unique understanding of the land by meticulously observing the interaction between soil, slope and exposure to the sun. Over time, they divided the land into distinct plots known as "climats", each with its own specific identity and potential for quality wine production. These climats, delimited by stone walls, are now a defining feature of Burgundy's vineyard system and have been recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2015.

One of the most prestigious of these climats is "Les Beaux Monts", located in the Vosne-Romanée appellation. The midslop vineyard enjoys an ideal east-facing exposure and sits on classic clay-limestone soils, which contribute to wines of great complexity, and aging potential. The Vosne-Romanée appellation itself, officially established in 1936, is one of Burgundy's most celebrated appellations, known exclusively for its Pinot Noir wines.

The Pascale Rion Vosne-Romanée 1er Cru « Les Beaux Monts » is a pure expression of this exceptional terroir and comes from 50 years old Pinot noir vines, grown without plowing to preserve soil balance. Organic techniques such as vine shoot crushing and green cover crops (clover and fava beans) enhance biodiversity. The result is a wine of great finesse, with red berry and floral notes. Its structure and balance are shaped by the character of the terroir and the care brought to its cultivation.
