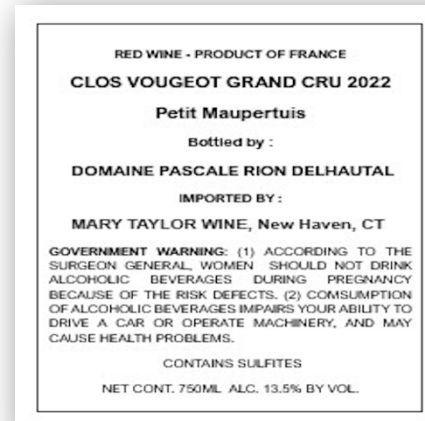


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## *Pascale Rion Clos Vougeot Grand Cru*



Clos Vougeot Grand Cru is not only one of the most prestigious vineyards in Burgundy, but also one of the most historically significant. Established in the early 12<sup>th</sup> century by the Cistercian monks of the Abbey of Citeaux, it was enclosed by stone walls as early as 1336, giving rise to the very concept of a “clos” in Burgundian viticulture.

Spanning over 50 hectares, Clos Vougeot is the largest Grand Cru in the Côte de Nuits area and is today shared among more than 80 different producers. The vineyard stretches from the mid to lower slopes of the Côte d’Or, with soils ranging from gravelly limestone on the higher parcels to rich, clay-dominated soils at the bottom. These geological contrasts yield wines of remarkable depth and layered character, combining power and structure with elegance and aging potential.

Wines from Clos Vougeot are exclusively made from Pinot Noir and offer a classic expression of Côte de Nuits, dense and concentrated on the palate, with aromas of dark cherry, violet, forest floor and subtle spice. The best examples are shaped by sensitive farming and precise vinification, often requiring several years of cellaring to reveal their full complexity. Though no longer a monopole, the Clos retains a powerful symbolic unity and continues to embody the soul of monastic winemaking tradition, enhanced today by generations of passionate vignerons such as the Rion family.
